Standard Bank contributed NAD1 million to the event in hopes that we can change the lives of these young athletes and show them we believe and invest in their talents. It Can Be.




THE NAMIBIA SECONDARY SCHOOL RUGBY SEASON ENDS ON A HIGH!

The Namibian Secondary School Rugby (NSSR) league made an annual return with Standard Bank as the main tournament sponsor. The Standard Bank Namibian Secondary School Rugby Super League recently concluded after an absence of interactive sporting activities due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the excitement of secondary school sport was highly welcomed.

The tournament saw a total of 65 teams and over 35 high schools take part in the various age categories, U'14 – 6 teams, U'15 – 23 teams, and U'19 – 36 teams from various secondary school across Namibia. The league is aimed at showcasing schools' rugby as a sport in Namibia and identifying talented young players for the future, giving them a pathway to the national teams. The Under-19 super league finals took place at the Windhoek Gymnasium School with the host in the finals against Windhoek Afrikaans Private School, Windhoek Gymnasium won the finals to defend the previous title holders by a single point, with a last-minute penalty in front of the post.

‘Creating a platform for secondary school rugby encourages young players to grow and build character on and off the field. Due to the short season, players learned to endure, learned to be disciplined, and augment teamwork’ said Mr. Daniels, the NSSR rugby chairperson. The event was fully embraced by the both the players, coaches, and parents, as the return of the school rugby meant the players are back on top performing stages again.

Daniels added that “Learners can compete in school rugby again at the highest level and can look forward to being selected to National Schools Rugby teams. Through rugby, children can develop the capability to analyse and deduce general principles in life which can in turn boost their social and physical agility.”


